 - For example how do you differentiate the responsibilities of development vs. asset management staff? Who takes on refinances? How are specialized functions (e.g., sustainability) integrated?
- Project Advancement: Who gets to make decisions, and at which points in the development process?
 - o Where does spending authority sit? How does your team decide which deal to do?
 - Have you implemented changes to make decision-making more efficient?
