Yesler Terrace: Public Housing Transformation

OFF-SITE SESSION

Thursday, June 6th • 1:30pm • 808 Fir Street

Description: Originally completed in 1941, Yesler Terrace was the first racially integrated public housing development in the U.S. Over the past decade, this 30-acre site has been transformed into a dynamic, environmentally sustainable, mixed-use, mixed income community in the heart of Seattle. We'll be joined by staff from Seattle Housing Authority, Community Roots Housing and the Seattle Chinatown International District Preservation and Development Authority (SCIDpda) to walk through the community, go off-site to visit a nearby replacement housing project known as 13th and Fir (previously known as Yesler Family Housing) and discuss this neighborhood evolution.

Please note: this off-site will involve about 1 mile of walking between sites.
